On behalf of the Standing International Conference of Inspectorates and the Austrian Ministry of Education we would like to invite you to a SICI-workshop in Vienna that will take place on May 17-19, 2017.

The topic of the workshop is "Roles and Responsibilities in School Quality Management – the Austrian Approach".

The workshop is focusing on the currently implemented model of the Austrian system of school quality development and assurance in general education (SQA). We want to share our approach to this topic with you and exchange knowledge and experiences with other inspectorates.

It is our great pleasure to inform you that well-known researchers from the OECD, Germany and Austria will share their knowledge in this field of expertise with us.

In addition you will have the opportunity to discuss the SQA-approach with Austrian stakeholders from the Ministry of Education, from the school inspectorate and from school representatives.
